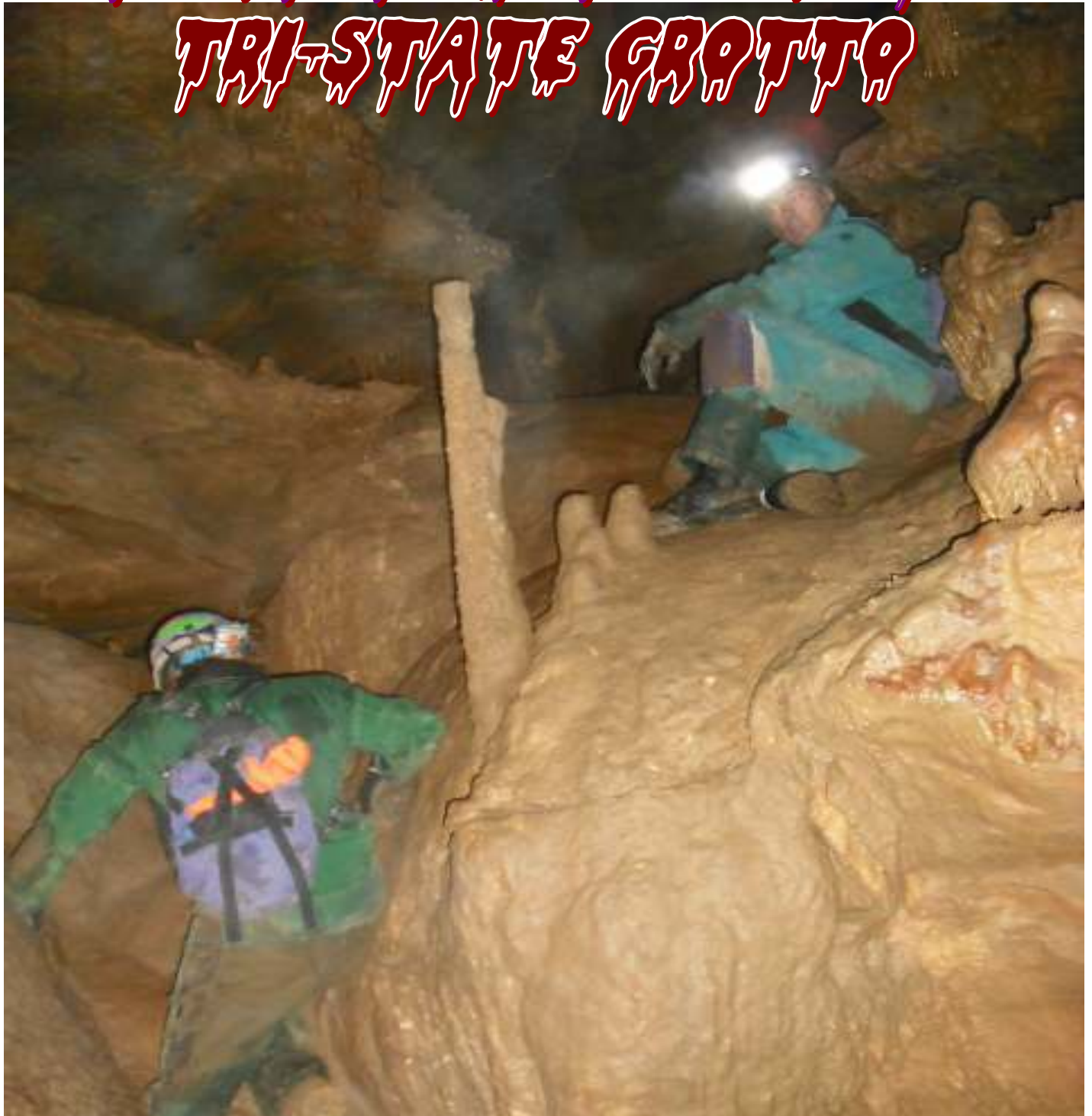

There, it was decided that six of our number would travel on to the DC Grotto Room.

Understand that no one had been to the DCG Room since 1996. The six that went on had to endure exposed climbs, and several low, tight crawls. Success was met at the end where Stephen described a tube-like passage laying at a 70 degree angle. Proceeding upward, with arms stretched before them, they all found purchase through wiggling, wedging and winging. All six made it!

## Subject: Baker Quarry: Gating Repairs

2-gates;

Upper: sealing the hole with concrete over metal deck (I have the metal deck & just need laborers to carry bags of concrete up the hill to mix & pour over the deck). Some minor welding may be necessary to secure the deck prior to pouring concrete over it.

Lower gate: Weld shut (temporarily for about 1-2 years) or provide a secure lock box. If we are going to go through the effort to get a welder (Doug Duncan has offered) on-site, then a lock box may be appropriate.

"Unfortunately, the rescue yesterday turned into a body recovery. Tim McClain was with other cavers two miles back in the Blowing Hole entrance to Binkley's Cave in Corydon, IN. Tim had a heart attack and died, I'm not sure when. His body has been brought to the surface already.

## Sinnett-Thorn Cave

It is pretty amazing how things work out if you just allow them to do it. I was starting to think about VAR and what trip I could do on Friday and who would want to go on a Friday trip? Well as things go Pat Bingham offered to have Sinnet-Thorn Cave open for two weeks. Well I stated the process of getting permission to get the Friday of VAR. Well what luck no one else got it so I was locked in for Friday he 27<sup>th</sup> of September.

I sent out the email listing the cave trip to Sinnet-Thorn Cave and that we were going to look for the DCG room which is above the waterfall in the rear of the cave. Now the DCG room apparently has not been visited in quite awhile and Pat wanted someone to find it. The group of cavers going on

the Friday trip was as follows: Eric Berge, Doug Duncan, Roxanne Shivley, Jerry Bowen, Stephen Bowen, Emily Ford, Greg Jones, Dave Knox, and Alexis Morano. What a crew we had.

The 27<sup>th</sup> approached and at the parking area we all changed and crossed over the creek to the entrance. Once inside we got through the gate and Doug took the lead and I stayed in the sweep position (rear). Made really good progress to the Waterfall Room which involves a little bit of crawling and climbing. The week end before John Harman was in the cave and stated he would leave markers to show where the passage to the DCG room was. He and his group were going to look for the room also. We all climbed above the waterfall going along the left side of the waterfall room and then climbed up a small wall into another passageway that leads to a very nice spacious room. In this room there is a climb on the right wall and Dug said it was not a very friendly climb. Well as we were looking at his climb Dave and Greg went into the ceiling and found a small but passable passageway unless you are a little large. This passageway consists of a nine inch pinch. Well actually from what I saw the whole thing was nine inches. Well Dave and Greg went through the crawl and yelled down that the passageway opens up and keeps going. Into the ceiling went Stephen and Emily, next went Roxanne and Greg and I followed Greg. Well I watched Greg go through and I figured I would try and the minute I slid in the passage I knew I was too large. We worked a plan where I would go to the big room above the silo and look around with Jerry and Alexis.



The story ends here about finding the DCG room, Doug or another person that was along with him will have to fill in the blocks on the DCG room. But Alexis has never been in Sinnett-Thorn before and Jerry and I want to show him the big room and take a look at the connection to Thorn cave.

I went up the silo first and to be honest I was tired and each foot and hand hold I found was chore, I just took my time and grunted with each foot up. I told the two guys behind me that I would throw down a piece of webbing to make it easier. Well they were actually right behind me as I went up and the webbing was not much use for the climb up but would be handy for the climb down. Through the breakdown we went into the big room and it always amazes me the size of the room. The weather outside was still warm and there were plenty of insects for the bats to eat so there were not that many bats roosting in the ceiling, maybe 100 or so. We went to the right and took a look at the few formations at that end of the room, and then moved to the middle of the room and went up into the wall and took a look at the connection. The connection crawl had about 5 inches of water in it and the air was flowing so fast out of the connection that the water had a ripple on it.

After a few photos we to the left side of the large room and looked around. It had been 2 hours since we had split the group and we started making our way back to the silo and I brought up the rear. If you have never seen the silo it is pretty cool but so many people have climbed it is very smooth. So when I started climbing down I just doubled over the webbing (it is 70 feet in length) and used it to make it to a secure place to land. Once there we all went down. Well one part of the climb down you actually have to sit on a slanted slab of stone slowly slide down the slab. Well that is when I got a Charlie hoarse in both legs, and shoulders. Well I just sat there till the cramps ended and climbed on down.

Once in the passageway we knew the other group had not been there yet because of the gear we left was still there. We decided to wait for a while and see if they come out so we waited for about 20 minutes and then decide to make our way to the

waterfall. Well as soon as I got about 30 feet into the passageway I hear them coming. I turned around and we all meet in the passageway going out. After a few minutes of talking it was determined that they had been through quit and ordeal and were tired and ready to head out. Out we went. And I'll tell you it is amazing how fast we made it out. Once outside a few photos were taken and what I heard that really impressed me about the DCG room since I did not get to see it was that it was very beautiful but very hard to get to and everyone was happy to have seen it but it would not bother anyone if they did not go back. We all had a great time. The one question I have is what happened to all the pretty coveralls?
